

Six Wintertime Propane Tips

During times of heavy snowfall, it's important to be sure that your propane tanks remain accessible so you can continue to receive your propane deliveries when you need them.

Please follow the following winter weather tips to keep your propane coming when you need it most.

- 1. Mark your underground tanks** - Use a flag higher than the anticipated snowfall to indicate the location of underground tanks during heavy snow accumulations.
- 2. Clean snow from your tanks** - Use a broom to clear snow from the tank. Use a soft touch when cleaning off your propane tank, or any other hardware. Using your snow shovel (or more heavy-duty equipment) can damage or puncture the tank.
- 3. Keep your driveway clear** - Keep a clear path in your driveway so we can make deliveries to your house in inclement weather.
- 4. Keep a path clear to your tank** - Keep a clear path from your driveway to your propane tanks.
- 5. Don't run out of gas** - Keep enough gas in your tank to tide you through an emergency. Let your Paraco customer service representative Paraco know if your gauge is reading less than 35 percent (or take advantage of our Tank Butler option so you never run out of propane again).
- 6. Keep your generator full** - If you have a generator, keep a full, dedicated propane tank on hand in case emergency backup power is needed.
